EPREP TIP for August: **Phone and cellphone use during a disaster**: Phones with cordless handsets won't work during a power outage because they need more electricity than they can get from the phone jack. Old fashioned phones with a cord connecting the handset to the base will work even in a power outage. Make sure you have at least one phone with a cord in your home in case of a power outage. Or, keep a car charger for your cell phone in your vehicle. If the power is out in your home, you can still charge your cell phone in your car. Solar chargers are yet another option for cell phones when the power goes out. If you don't have a landline and you use a cell phone as your home phone, remember that cell phone towers may be tied up with calls in an emergency. However, a text message from your cell phone may get through when a phone call doesn't. Make sure everyone in your family knows how to send and receive text messages. Do you have emergency volunteers on your block? If so, a volunteer in a snappy orange vest has visited your home or chatted with you during a block party. If not, help us recruit one...next training for **Block Preparedness Coordinators** (BPC) is August 9th at Lucie Stern at 6:30 PM. Ideally we would have one or two BPCs on every street in our city. The role of a BPC is simple: following a disaster, check on those who live near you and report problems to the Neighborhood Preparedness Coordinator (who in turn reports issues up to the City of Palo Alto Emergency Services). By looking out for each other, our neighborhood will be more resilient. In times of a disaster, your best resource is your closest resource - a Palo Alto Emergency Service Volunteer. **CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) training** (20 + hours) starts on September 12. This program trains you in basic disaster response skills, such as small fire suppression, light search and rescue, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members will work as a team with other Emergency Service Volunteers - neighborhood and block preparedness coordinators - in their neighborhood following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. NEW: The Basic Citizens Police Academy is an 8-week FREE course designed to foster increased understanding and communication between community members and the police. Instructors are public safety employees who will present on topics such as patrol procedures, laws of arrest, search and seizure, community relations, criminal investigations, evidence collection, police accountability, use of force and officer safety, disaster preparedness, and more.
