## 1) MIDTOWN TIDBITS

**EPREP Tip:** We've all heard about the recent flooding in San Jose and how people had to evacuate. A fire, extreme flooding, an earthquake, etc. are all situations in which we might have to evacuate. **Planning ahead of time** what to do if we had to evacuate would make a bad situation less stressful. Here are some tips to getting started: Source: <u>www.Ready.gov</u>

- Choose several destinations in different directions and know the evacuation routes to get there.
- Plan places where your family will meet within and outside of your immediate neighborhood. Create a Family Emergency Communication Plan to decide these locations before a disaster happens and give a copy to each family member.
- If you don't have a car, plan how you will leave if you have to evacuate. Make arrangements with family, friends, or your local government;
- Take your emergency supply kit with you.
- Practice getting out of the house quickly, and drive your planned evacuation route. The more you practice, the more confident you will be if you really have to evacuate.
