**EPREP TIP for July:** If you are driving during an earthquake, pull over as quickly as possible to a clear location, stop and set the parking brake. Avoid bridges, overpasses, trees, and power lines. If you're in the mountains, watch for falling rocks and debris. Most importantly, stay in your vehicle with your seat belt buckled. If you leave your vehicle, it will block the road so emergency crews will have a harder time getting where they need to be.
