Trail and bridge closures update: The San Francisquito Creek Flood Protection Project continues work east of Highway 101. The project work schedule is extended to accommodate mandatory protection requirements for the federally endangered Ridgway's Rail bird, which includes restricted work times and locations depending on the proximity of the bird to the project site. The goal is to complete project construction by the end of 2018 & to open the creekside trails & Friendship Bridge as soon as possible. After evaluating safety conditions, it was determined that Friendship Bridge and the creekside trails between East Bayshore Road and the Bay will remain closed through December 28, 2018. Starting on December 29, 2018, the bridge and all trails are expected to permanently reopen for public use.

FEBRUARY 22; USGS Monthly Lecture: The **USGS Cascades Volcano Observatory -** Research, monitoring, and the science of preparing society for low-probability, high-consequence events by Seth Moran, Scientist-in-Charge, USGS Cascades Volcano Observatory. Although eruptions are generally not as high-consequence as large earthquakes, they are still high-consequence events.
