NEW **ARTWORK AT GOLF COURSE** : Meet Birdie, a welcome addition to the Palo Alto collection of permanent public art! Installed at the Palo Alto Municipal Golf Course along Embarcadero Road, the playful origami inspired sculpture by Bay Area artist Joyce Hsu, Birdie looks out on the Baylands Natural Preserve, joyfully reminding visitors of this unique setting and important habitat for migratory birds. A humorous play on words, Birdie spreads its kinetic wings while balancing on a white tee. The Municipal Golf Course is scheduled to re-open in Spring 2018. The artwork is currently accessible to the general public.

SUSTAINABLE LIVING TIP FOR FEBRUARY submitted by Greg Bell: - LED LIGHTING. For less than \$100, buy energy-efficient LED light bulbs & replace your old incandescent bulbs. Quality LED bulbs are now about \$2.50 each in a multi-pack. At this low price, LED bulbs pay for themselves by reducing your energy bill - usually in months. US Dept of Energy says less than 20% of lighting in US homes is energy efficient. Efficient lighting means less energy is used so less coal & natural gas is burned to produce electricity. Go to Home Depot or OCH with your family & buy LED bulbs or order directly from Amazon. There are sooooo many light bulbs available, your eyes will glaze over. To simplify choosing, I have tested and recommend - ONLY 5 LED bulbs - for most fixtures on my Sustain Times site. https://sustaintimes.net/buildings/
