FEBRUARY 24, Saturday. Free Emergency Prep Class for 3-5th Graders from 1-2 PM, Cubberley Room H-1: Do your kids know what to do if a disaster strikes? MARCH 5 start: Do you want to become trained as a member of the City of Palo Alto Office of Emergency Services' Community Emergency Response Team? The CERT program trains community members in basic disaster response skills, such as small fire suppression, light search and rescue, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. The CERT curriculum includes 24 hours of training over 7 session. The Spring 2018 session occurs from 6:30 -o 9:30 PM on March 5, 7, 12, 14, 19, and 21, with a five-hour "field day" from noon - 5 PM on Sunday, March 25. Students must attend and complete all sessions to become certified. The location is at the Adobe Room of the Mitchell Park Community Center in Palo Alto. There is no fee, and you do NOT need to be a Palo Alto resident to participate. Space is limited, so register ASAP to ensure you get a spot.
